



Charnwood All Crime Delivery Group **Update Report for August 2010**

As the Chair of the All Crime Delivery Group it gives me pleasure to report on the work being carried out to meet the programme of work as set out in the action plan which was approved at the 17th June 2010 meeting of Charnwood Community Safety Partnership.

The All crime group covers acquisitive crime, violent crime including the night time economy, domestic abuse and hate crime. The Charnwood Community Safety Partnership aims to reduce these crimes by raising public awareness, reducing opportunities for offences to take place and increasing detection of these crimes.

The delivery group undertakes a range of projects and initiatives to tackle this crime type. This can include running awareness campaigns, such as the one running at the moment to raise awareness of the services that are available to male victims of domestic abuse, motor vehicle crime, which has seen a small rise, robbery and burglary and specific police operations aimed at reducing these crimes.

The delivery group is planning the activities for when the students return in October to help prevent them becoming victims of crime these will include

- A door knocking campaign
- Providing property marking pens and information
- Using the ADVAN campaign in November to provide another reminder to make sure their property is secure.

The Domestic Abuse Forum, who are a sub group of the All Crime Delivery Group are planning for the November Domestic Abuse Awareness Campaign these will include

- A conference highlighting the problems of stalking and harassments for victims of domestic abuse
- An ADVAN campaign highlighting the relevant numbers for Charnwood.

The Night time Economy Group will be looking at venues that are showing up as hot spot locations and will be targeted through a multi agency approach.



The next meeting of the All Crime Delivery Group focus on the action plan and identify any actions that are required to meet any emerging issues.

The membership of the group is expanding and now includes Victim Support, Futures Unlocked and Loughborough Probation and is being held at Loughborough Probation offices.

The one concern that the group has raised is that the Night Time Economy Sub group are not meeting as regularly as they previously did but this has been due to the changes in chair and ill health. This should be remedy by the next main partnership meeting.
